Additional Support Lecturers

We are all qualified and experienced teachers working with students who have learning difficulties or physical disabilities. We each link to different Departments within the college and provide a range of services for students including:

- Assessment of support needs
- Specialist teaching one-to-one or small group
- The organisation of support
- Provision of specialist software, technology and equipment
- Provision of in-class Academic Support Workers
- Liaising with Personal Tutors and Lecturers

We are also able to arrange further specialist assessments for students using our links with the RNIB and other external support agencies. In addition, most of the team have specialist qualifications and experience. This means we can provide assessment, help and support for things like dyslexia, hearing impairments and other more complex needs.

Care Assistants

As Care Assistant Team Leader, I assess students for their personal care needs which could include help to get around the college and support during breaks and mealtimes. I also supervise the Care Assistants across the whole Hugh Baird College site and provide training and guidance to assist them in their work.

The Care Assistants are a team of experienced staff who will support students so they can access College facilities and attend classes. The team also provides assistance with students who need time out of class. If students have mobility difficulties or are just vulnerable or lacking in confidence, we can help them to feel more included within the college and so become independent, confident students.

Academic Support Workers

The ASW Team provide support to students in their classes, whether they are practical or theory sessions.

We all receive training in the City and Guilds 732 qualification in Learner Support which is taught by members of the Additional Support Lecturer team. Our duties can involve note-taking, further explanations of activities and tasks, or even just someone to help keep students on task and progressing towards achieving their qualifications.

At exam times, we sometimes act as scribes or readers when students are entitled to an exam concession.

Specialist Dyslexic Tutors

We are all qualified and experienced dyslexic tutors who provide assessments, advice and guidance for both learners and tutors. We also provide:

- 1:1 specialist dyslexia tuition.
- Dyslexia screening and assessment.
- Assessments for examination access arrangements.
- Study skills support.
- Arrange Educational Psychologist assessments for individuals who are progressing to higher education.
- Support with utilising assistive technology.
- Help individuals to develop and build on successful learning strategies.
