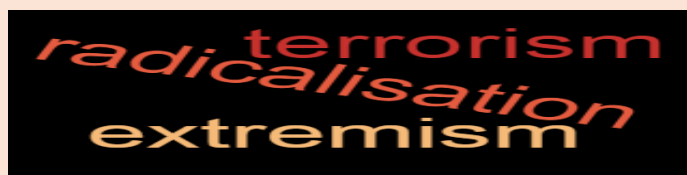

We hope that your Christmas and New year were safe and enjoyable. The first IN4M bulletin of 2018 is on the subject of the Prevent Strategy.

What is the PREVENT Strategy?

The Prevent Strategy aims to stop people being drawn into radicalisation, extremism and terrorism.



PREVENT forms one of the four strands of the **CONTEST** strategy which aims to reduce the risk of terrorism and is split into four strands, known as the '**four P's**': **Prevent, Pursue, Protect, and Prepare.**

THE FOUR P's

PREPARE aims to moderate the impact of any terrorist attack, if it can't be prevented. This includes work to end an attack once it's underway & to improve the country's resilience so we can recover from such occurrence.

PROTECT aims recognise threats and identify appropriate measures to reduce risks. Protect aims to strengthen protection of our border security, transport systems and infrastructure in order to reduce our vulnerability to terrorist attacks.

PURSUE aims to detect, disrupt or prosecute those who plot to carry out attacks against the UK.

PREVENT aims to stop people from supporting terrorism or becoming terrorists. It challenges extreme views and ideologies. The Prevent Team work with vulnerable individuals to prevent them from becoming radicalized to extremism.

What can I do if I am affected or worried about someone I know?

If you have any concerns regarding any behaviours, actions, opinions or attitudes displayed by anyone, please make a referral to the Safeguarding team. You can make a safeguarding referral through your college desktop, and a member of the team will contact you to discuss your concerns in private.

You can also call in to the Pod, at any time, to speak to a Safeguarding Officer. The team are always here to listen to you and to support you with any issues that you may be concerned about.
