






IN4M: Information in 4 Minutes

Fake news – not everything online is true. Some people may tell lies. They may lie about who they are. Always better to check information by looking at other websites or talking to someone who knows.

Keep yourself safe - use safety tools on networks and other online services, e.g. Facebook privacy settings. Only open messages from sources that you can trust. Opening messages or content from unknown sources can contain unpleasant content or viruses. Don't give out personal information online, this includes your email address, phone number and password.

Do you know who you are talking to - Meeting someone in person, that you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with parents/carers' permission and never go to meet anyone alone.

Bullying and radicalisation can take place on line - Be careful who you talk to and be careful about what their motives are.

Don't give in to pressure - If you're doing something that you don't want to tell your friends or family about then it's probably something you just should be doing.
